Quick Tip - Overlander63

If you have a flat tire on a tandem-axle trailer, put a couple of 2x6's in front of the 'good' tire, and slowly pull the trailer up onto the boards. This will let the flat tire hang free for changing or removal. Remember to loosen the lug nuts before raising the flat off the ground, and if you are not replacing the tire, and continuing your trip on three tires, keep your speed at 40 mph (60K m/h) or less until you get the tire replaced.


