ARRIVAL–UNHITCHING:

- 1. Note position of services and position the trailer. (Room for awning to extend, hoses and cords to reach connections, hatch to open, room to park the truck after unhitching.
- 2. Turn off TPMS.
- 3. Fold in towing mirrors to reduce head-bonking, remove if you are staying a few days.
- 4. Unlock and open front storage compartment.
- 5. Check for E/W Level, use Anderson blocks as needed.
- 6. Chock the wheels.
- 7. Lower the jack onto Anderson blocks, lift enough to reduce tongue load.

8. Unhitch the trailer

- a. Disconnect break-away cable
- b. Disconnect safety chains
- c. Disconnect 7-pin cable and cap it
- d. Use the drill to un-tension the WD bars
- e. Loosen the over-center connections and put snap-rings back into stinger
- f. Gently pull the truck forward until it is clear of the trailer
- g. Tell the truck the trailer is disconnected (mileage counter)
- h. Remove stinger from truck and lock coupler.
- 9. Lower the jack until N/S level is achieved.
- 10. Cover the Hensley hitch.
- 11. Use electric drill to lower and position each stabilizer on an Anderson block
- 12. Unlock the main door

ARRIVAL–UNHITCHING:

13. Electric

- a. Set the power cutoff switch to 1+2
- b. Connect the surge protector to the power pole
- c. Turn on the 50 amp breaker and confirm good power
- d. Connect the gray electric cable to the surge protector
- e. Connect the gray cable to the trailer
- f. Set trailer switch to "Use" Check voltage inside.

14. Water

- a. Connect pressure regulator to hose bib
- b. Connect in-line filter to regulator
- c. Connect white hose to filter
- d. Turn on water just enough to fill up hose and then turn off
- e. Connect hose to trailer with 90° elbow
- f. Turn the water on all the way
- g. Check water pressure in RV and bleed out air bubbles.
- h. Turn on the hot water heater (electric)
- i. Verify water pump is off

15. HVAC

- a. Open vents and/or windows as needed
- b. Turn on fans, heat or AC as needed
- 16. Close and lock the front storage door.

ARRIVAL–UNHITCHING:

- 17. Propane If previously shut down
 - a. Turn on the propane
 - b. Verify green flag in regulator
 - c. Test light stove
 - d. Open exhaust fan vent
 - e. Turn on water heater (gas mode if needed)
 - f. Turn the fridge on and set it to "auto"

18. Cable

- a. If cable TV, then connect it up
- b. Program TV for digital cable if necessary

19. Set up patio

- a. Roll out area rug
- b. set welcome mat
- c. setup folding chairs
- d. setup awnings if desired
- e. setup Weber
- 20. Lock the truck
- 21. Recreate
 - a. Take the dog for a nice walk around the campground
- 22. Relax and have some dinner

- 1. Turn on the TPMS monitor, pocket it
- 2. Open front storage compartment
- 3. If the cable TV cable is in use, disconnect it, coil it and put it away.
- 4. Turn off water and disconnect clean water hose from trailer.
- 5. Put cap back on the city water inlet
- 6. If the water tank needs water, fill it now.
- 7. Drain the clean water hose and screw it together.
- 8. Put the clean hose back in the front storage compartment.
- 9. IF THE WASTE TANKS ARE AT LEAST 75% FULL:
 - a. Pull out the orange water hose from the front storage compartment
 - b. Connect orange hose to hose bib
 - c. Connect other end to flush inlet
 - d. Gloves on
 - e. Pull out the sewer hose and elbow from storage and connect up between trailer and dump hole
 - f. set up the slinky ramp and confirm consistent pitch
 - g. Double check fittings are engaged
 - h. Open valve for black water and wait for it to drain
 - i. Turn on the water and flush black water tank, run till clear
 - j. Stop flushing the black water tank by turning off the water
 - k. After it stops draining, close the valve for black water
 - I. Open valve for grey water tank and wait for it to drain
 - m. Close the valve for grey water.
 - n. Drain the sewer hose by gently lifting segments leading the water to the outlet.

- o. Disconnect the sewer hose at trailer and do the same trick again to minimize any water going outside the drain hole.
- p. compress sewer hose and re-install caps
- q. Put sewer hose accoutrements away
- r. Remove dirty hose from inlet, cap the inlet.
- s. Use dirty hose to clean any spillage
- t. Drain and put dirty hose away.
- u. Put at least a couple of gallons into each of the two tanks, black and grey.
- v. Add chemicals to black water tank via toilet, leave 1" water in the bowl
- w. Add chemicals into grey water tank via bathroom sink.
- 10. Verify tank levels with onboard display.
- 11. Turn OFF water pump
- 12. Turn OFF water heater
- 13. Put away everything inside the trailer that might fall to the floor.
 - a. Make the bed and clear up the bedroom
 - b. Clear out the bathroom and put everything away
 - c. Clear away everything in the galley and living room
 - d. Close all the windows and the roof vents
 - e. turn off AC/Heat from thermostat
- 14. Turn off the propane if traveling without refrigerator
- 15. Close exhaust fan vent
- 16. Turn off the breaker at the power box.
- 17. Unplug from the power box.
- 18. Disconnect the Trailer from electric power.
- 19. Put the power cords away in the front compartment.

20. Check the TPMS to see whether the trailer's tires are set to 75 PSI

- a. If not, use the compressor from the truck to pump up the trailer tires.
- b. Put the compressor back in the truck
- 21. Bring in the awnings and door mat
- 22. Raise the stabilizers and put the Anderson blocks away
- 23. Re-hitch the trailer
 - a. Mount the stinger on the truck
 - b. Align truck to hitch
 - c. Use the jack to raise the trailer tongue so the truck hitch will align.
 - d. Back the truck up until stinger is fully engaged.
 - e. Remove snap rings and engage over-center latches, replace snap rings
 - f. Use the drill to tension the WD bars.
 - g. Lower the trailer onto truck and retract jack fully
 - h. Cross & attach the safety chains-between WD bars
 - i. Attach the break-away cable
 - j. Attach the 7-pin cable, store the cap.
 - k. Put away the Anderson block from under the jack.
- 24. Remove and store the chocks.
- 25. Walk all around the rig. Look for anything you may have forgotten. Look at the tires. Look at the roof to see if any vents are open.
- 26. Check the brake lights and turn signals on the trailer.
- 27. Tell the truck the trailer is connected (mileage counter)
- 28. Go back inside the trailer
 - a. Sweep it out and shake out the rugs
 - b. Make sure everything is put away.

- c. Make sure shower door and drawers are closed & latched
- d. Turn off all the light switches
- 29. Fold up and put away the steps
- 30. If leveling blocks are in use, drive off them and put them away. Stow set.
- 31. Walk all around the campsite to ensure that everything has been picked up and stored.
- 32. Verify the following:
 - a. Steps are up
 - b. Stabilizers are all the way up
 - c. Power cords are stowed
 - d. Surge protector is stowed
 - e. Water and sewer hoses are stowed
 - f. All hitch connections are correct: hitched, latched & locked, chains attached, 7-pin attached, break-away cable attached
 - g. Hitch jack is all the way up
 - h. Power switch set to 1 (forward)
 - i. All hitching tools put away
- 33. Close, latch and lock the front storage compartment and the bumper.
- 34. Close, latch and lock the trailer entry door.
- 35. Get ready to leave
 - a. Put mirrors into towing configuration
 - b. Start the engine
 - c. Turn on the rear view video screen
 - d. Push tow/haul button
 - e. Check the trailer brakes
 - f. Ensure that all wheels roll when you pull forward a couple of feet

ARRIVAL-REMAINING HITCHED:
